



CREATING A CAMPUS

Strule Shared Education Campus has been fundamentally designed to encourage cohesion and partnership by individual schools co-operating and working together.

The close proximity of the schools will allow opportunities for collaboration and shared education within the core school buildings and shared facilities.

The site has three distinct levels with significant falls between each. To manage these level changes, buildings have been logically located to bring balance to the overall campus - lower buildings are placed on higher ground while higher buildings are on lower ground, creating a user friendly central core which is easily accessible to all.

VEHICLE & PEDESTRIAN MOVEMENT

The central core of the campus will be pedestrianised providing a safe thoroughfare for student and staff movement.

A peripheral service road allows access for goods delivery, school meals, service and maintenance, bus drop-off, refuse collection, emergency access and provision for those with disability to have direct vehicle access to each school.

THE ENVIRONMENT

Areas of existing woodland will be retained and enhanced with additional planting, while existing habitats will be protected with areas of wild and meadowland grass. Upper levels will be landscaped with trees and plants, creating a natural open parkland setting.

Trees and informal landscaping will be used around the schools to provide a sense of enclosure without the need for internal fencing.
